NE Tacoma Community Clean-Up Day on June 17th! Volunteers Needed!

You should have received a postcard from the City advertising the Community Clean-Up Day in NE Tacoma on Saturday, June 17th, 10am-1:45pm. It is being held at Meeker Middle School's upper/east parking lot—enter off Nassau Ave. NE. This is the 6th year of this great event in NE Tacoma! NETNC is partnering with the City's Solid Waste Division, Community-Based Services, and local volunteer groups to carry this event out. You just need to bring your unwanted stuff over. Help will be available if you can't get it to Meeker.

All kinds of stuff can be accepted: household junk, tires, appliances, furniture, clothes, etc., saving you from a trip to the Solid Waste Transfer Station on S. Mullen St. Reusable objects in good condition may be accepted by the Goodwill folks on site. Goodwill will also responsibly recycle old TVs and computers.

Bikes in any condition will be accepted by the Marine View Presbyterian's Bikes for Kids program—if they are not in great shape or easily repairable, they will be parted-out and any scrap sold for cash to support the program. Repaired bikes are sent to area social service agencies for distribution to needy kids.

Materials not accepted include hazardous waste, include fluorescent tubes and bulbs. Save those for the transfer station on S. Mullen St. or the drop-off event likely scheduled for NE Tacoma in August.

Although we have a good bunch of volunteers coming, we always need more help unloading cars, directing traffic, and caring for the other volunteers. Please let Jim Philp, 253.952.0509 or j.b.p@att.net, know your availability. A full shift is from about 9:30am to 2pm, but shorter periods can be worked out.

NE Tacoma Crime News

Crimereports.com shows crimes during May and June to date: vandalism, burglaries/breaking and entering, thefts, simple assaults (likely domestic violence), assault with a deadly weapon, and impersonations (likely door-to-door folks). The site is useful for seeing what kinds of things are going on, especially in your immediate neighborhood, but it tends to exaggerate some crime reports because of the simplicity of the description possibilities. For example, minor property theft often gets reported as a burglary, which we would usually associate with a house burglary with more major property theft.

About Morse Wildlife Preserve

The Morse Wildlife Preserve was established by a donation of land from Lloyd and Maxine Morse. Situated at the headwaters of the north fork of Muck Creek, it consists of almost 100 acres. A tremendous volunteer effort is under way to reintroduce native prairie plants, remove invasive plant species, and foster the growth of the oak savannah. The Morse Force, which serves as the volunteer management team for the Preserve, holds monthly work parties to restore the wetland, prairie and upland habitats as well building a board walk

and new trails.

The preserve is a mosaic of forests, wetlands, meadow and remnant prairie home to a variety of birds and wildlife.

Please note that this private preserve is only open to the public for special events, scheduled field trips, and Second Sundays at Morse (on the 2nd Sunday of the month from 10am-4pm between April and October (please arrive by 3pm to allow time to explore the preserve).

In order to protect wildlife and people, pets are not permitted. If you are interested in volunteering at the preserve throughout the year, please call 253-565-9278 for more information or email:
